If you have a camera and your students are able to give a wave at the beginning of the call, it would be lovely for the farmerettes to have a sense of being in the classroom with you.
- When it comes time to ask questions, we are expecting a lot of them! We will get to as
 many as possible in the 20 minutes we have. If we don't get to all of them, the farmerettes
 have agreed to spend some time recording answers that we can share online and with you
 teachers directly, so stay tuned for that.
- Your students' questions can be typed into the chat bar, and our moderator will help work through those. If you would like to present a question in person, please raise your hand and we will do our best to get to you.
